Use at parties, at work in the break room, at school in the cafeteria, on an airplane and on public transit rides... to gain insight about yourself and your fellow participant in the quest for understanding of internal values and statements of what really matters.

Turn that camping trip into a spiritual awakening, or virtually any time to read and talk into a journey to enhanced emotional growth and maturation.

Questions are paired with multiple possible answers, but you are not required nor expected to follow them nor to conform your responses to the answers suggested for your consideration.

How Relationships are Based

Humans need various things, including true needs, peripheral needs and perceived needs. True needs include food and clean water (nutrition), protection from the elements (shelter), emotional warmth (touch), meaningful activities (work, exercise), resources used to contribute to the benefit of the community (integration), communication of experiences, values, feelings (expression), sexual expression (passion). Peripheral needs

include a car to drive to work, money to purchase goods and services, entertainment to distract from life's monotony, clothing beyond simple attire, tools except those used for community integration, and medical care. Perceived needs include fashionable clothing, luxury goods, artwork, music (unless used with work/integrating into community) and paying taxes used for war.

The goal of so-called "effective" advertising is to help sell the public goods and services that they would ordinarily have the good sense to avoid. To persuade, the advertising industry attempts to tap into emotions of needs and their gratification, to solicit an action of buying of the products and services of companies, corporations and nonprofit organizations.

The advertising industry generally runs against human wisdom, in that humans naturally value cooperation and sharing of resources, not hoarding commodities without end. Humans want – and need – true needs met, above both peripheral and perceived needs combined.

The advertising industry promises adoration, respect, prestige, and status, simply for buying their products and services. This deception targets the public at all ages, all educational levels, and all other demographics.

Examples of perceived needs gratification include fur coats, jewelry (except glass/plastic costume jewelry), and hair straightening. The fur coats deplete lives of animals, endanger human workers, and

the work output of distributors of the unnecessary type of coats. Diamond jewelry often is made from stones mined using slave labor, or whose money is used to fund rebel fighting factions against a region's government. Hair straightening uses chemicals of the earth that are dangerous, for no real advantage of anyone, except for financial gain of the service provider and their suppliers.

People desire adoration for their past deeds and character; respect for their sacrifices and past compromises; prestige from obeying authorities and the wealthy; status from honoring those in power unfairly by helping meet their needs and desires.

The quality of life is ameliorated and heightened by the proportion of true needs being met versus peripheral and perceived needs. The more human relationships of trust and closeness we develop, the more we meet true needs, and thereby change the ratio of true to peripheral and perceived needs.

All humans thrive on true needs being met. Relationships therefore, being a way to meet true needs, should be of paramount value and of utmost object of pursuit for all people, no matter their age or background.

People can get true needs met best by communicating with everyone they meet about their various true needs and levels of attainment.

When peripheral needs are talked about, discomfort may result, and trigger a communication reduction in the flow of dialog. Peripheral needs are often based on things we

want to have but don't need, and other people are most likely to covet and lust after, and see as a status item.

Knowing the three types of needs is important, because it helps give a person perspective as to what is truly important in their life: People and the working of resources to be shaped and configured using the labor and community involvement into useful, worthwhile products and services.

With relationships, the goals have to be for understanding and compassion, centered on meeting needs because it feels like the right thing to do, not in a vane hope to getting a certain action out of a communication partner (or relationship).

Knowing about human needs will bring into focus what topics and ideas are most appropriate. By appropriate, it is meant that the best communications center around compassionate listening, where the listener tries to echo back, using different words, the same overall idea.

By repeating back, using different words, the summary of the idea, trust is built up and a sense of emotional connection forms.

While talking, you may wish to interact with the person by making an indication of desired action. Here are the levels of desired action:

Advise. This is the softest level of desire for action. For making comments for consideration, and to keep self detached from being too much a part of a situation.

Invite. This is stronger

than advise, but weaker than a suggestion. For attempting to get an interaction to start with oneself, while remaining gentle and soft.

Suggest. This is stronger than invite, but weaker than a request. For implying some urgency, but keeping the level of attention required at a minimum.

Request. This is stronger than a suggestion, but weaker than a demand. For leading others to following our ideas and for them to use our knowledge, for better or worse for them.

Demand. Stronger than a request, but weaker than an order. To imply restriction will be imposed upon noncompliance, and to attempt to get full compliance by others with our ideas and knowledge.

Order. Stronger than a demand, but weaker than a command. For directing troops in a military, this is the typical level of direction and focus.

Command. Strongest level of desiring of action by another person. An urgent order, or other direction that is issued by the highest level authority, such as a president, to be obeyed and followed, without questioning.

The more often a person gives advise, invitations and suggestions, the less stress they will feel, and the more love they will experience.

The requests drain out energy in relationships, and cause deterioration of intimacy and closeness.

The demands tend to erode relationships quite quickly, and should be avoided.

Orders and Commands are reserved for authorities in a nation, such as from military

officers or the president himself. Within advise, invitations, suggestions, requests, demands, orders and commands, is the intentions that motivated their issue. For instance, we might be motivated to help get our needs met or the needs of a friend, or the needs we believe a community to have.

By noticing our intentions, and the intentions of others, we may become sensitive to the greater part of the message, such as is meant by "read between the lines" common phrase.

By showing that we hear the other person, by repeating back in our own paraphrase, we demonstrate to them that what they say matters and that we are not simply talking at them, but speaking with them. This is significant.

When someone is talked at, they feel lectured and tense. They are more defensive and less able to comprehend ideas.

When we speak with someone, in their judgment, then they feel cared about and relaxed. They are more agreeable and open, and can understand otherwise difficult concepts more readily.

So, when we communicate, it is an opportunity to share experience, wisdom and knowledge. The more we share, going both ways, the more both parties (or more parties) to a conversation stand to benefit.

Our experience is all that we have done, said, thought and felt over our entire life.

Our wisdom is all that we know to be true, from God, to help us know the reality of the spiritual and emotional realms.

Knowledge is everything else, in all things that we studied or can study, that is either in tangible form, or is abstract of the mind waiting to be affixed into tangible form.

It is unfortunate that so often, people are so focused on their own agenda, that they fail to listen, and speak requests or worse. By worse, it is meant demands (or orders or commands) are inappropriately issued.

When people are told what to do, they have their autonomy challenged and targeted for takeover, which leads to many people becoming hostile and angry.

People need to make their own mistakes. People need plenty of resources to be fully productive. When people are given scarce amounts of resources, they are in fear of losing the little they have, and become exceedingly docile.

The Christian Bible tells us that we should be grateful for the little amount of resources that we receive, and that God permits us to have, and that we should live in peace and love our oppressors.

God had a plan for peaceful change in getting the poor and oppressed in a new condition. The new condition is where wealth will be shared more evenly and uniformly, so when we peak near seven billion souls on this Earth, our political system will change to give more freedom and individual empowerment to the world than in all written history.
